
## A by Adina enters European market with Vienna opening

Situated on the banks of the river within the 180m-tall Danubeflats skyscraper – Austria's tallest residential tower – the property has been designed to blend the services


of a high-end hotel with the independence of apartment living. 120 studios are on offer, with one- or two-bedroom formations alongside living and kitchen spaces.
